My dear Huxley:

As I told you on your visit here, I contemplate sailing for England about June 11th and spending the summer in England, France and Italy. I have not made any definite arrangements with regard to the children for the summer, as a very capable nurse whose home is in England is making the trip with us and will be available to care for the children practically the entire summer. I wondered whether you could recommend any place in France where it might be particularly pleasant for the children and the nurse to be located for possibly six weeks or so while we are traveling in France and Italy. I should prefer, of course, some relatively quiet town or some location similar to the children's camps which occur in this country during the summertime, in the New England states.

Still another thought has occurred to me, that possibly there might be a very pleasant place to be had in Oxford itself, at which I could place the children and the nurse for three weeks or a month while we are in England, and I would possibly, of course, stay in Oxford a week myself to see that they were made comfortable and acquainted with the surroundings. Any suggestions or assistance which you may be in position to offer me in this particular from your detailed knowledge of the situation, will be greatly appreciated by me.
