Dear Miss Wiggin:

I enclose herewith my check for \$150.00, representing the deposit requested by your letter of March 8th for reservations for my three children - Annie Ray, Rosemary and Wm. Ward Watkin, Jr., ages 10, 8 and 5 respectively, at your summer camp and vacation house at Houlgate, Normandy, France.

It is our intention to sail so as to reach Liverpool about June 20th. While we will not spend any time in England beyond a few days, we will probably reach the camp with the children during the week of the 24th of June, possibly the 26th or 27th.

I will be glad if you will write me in full concerning clothing requirements for the children. I am reasonably familiar with the camp requirements, having formerly been at Quinebeck, South Fairlee, Vermont, but Mrs. Watkin would like to know more particularly as to the requirement in underwear as she is not familiar with the climatic conditions at Houlgate.

I should also like to have you write me in full concerning any other matters relating to the vacation house, and I would expect that Mrs. Watkin and I would probably stay some few days after bringing the children to the camp, in order to see that they were adjusting themselves to the place in a comfortable manner. You might recommend to me a hotel reasonably close to the camp.

It is our intention to return home, sailing September 19th, and that the children will stay at the camp until it closes, September 2nd. The understanding from your letter concerning reservations for the entire ten weeks is satisfactory.
