ALL being assembled at the place of the corner stone and taken their appointed places, the Minister shall say: Hymn 383 Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty.

**I**N the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Be kindly affectionate one to another, with brotherly love; in honor preferring one another, not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord.

LET US PRAY.

The Lord's Prayer: Our Father \* \* \*

*Minister says:* Our help is in the Name of the Lord.

*People answer:* Who hath made heaven and earth.

Blessed be Thy Name, O Lord, that it hath pleased Thee to put into hearts of Thy servants to build this House, a memorial to the blessed memory of James Lockhart Autry, to Thy Glory and for the use of Thy people. Accept, we pray Thee, the offering of Thy servants and remember for good all who have made this work possible. Let Thy blessing rest upon this house, that it may serve the purpose for which it was intended. Grant that here brotherly love and true fellowship may ever abound, and Thy people encourage one another in all good works, to the honor of Thy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

*The Minister says:* Behold how good and joyful a thing it is

*The People answer:* For brethren to dwell together in unity.

*M.* Behold I lay in Zion a chief corner stone, elect, precious.

*P.* And he that believeth in Him shall not be confounded.

*M.* The stone which the builders refused.

*P.* Is become the headstone of the corner.

*M.* This is the Lord's doing.

*P.* And it is marvelous in our eyes.

*M.* Other foundation can no man lay than that is laid.

*P.* Which is Jesus Christ.

Then the minister laying his hand upon the stone shall say:

O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who art the brightness of the Father's Glory, and the express image of His Person, the one Foundation, and the chief corner-stone; Bless what we now do (in laying this stone) in Thy Name, and be Thou, we beseech Thee, the beginning, the increase and the consummation of this our work, which is undertaken to the Glory of Thy Name, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit, livest and reignest one God, world without end. Amen.

Then all things being made ready, the Stone shall be laid by James Lockhart Autry, Jr., Rice 1921, with these words:

**In the Faith of Jesus Christ we place this Corner Stone in the Name of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. Amen.**

Then is sung Hymn 636 How Firm a Foundation, ye saints of the Lord. The lesson: I Corinthians XIII.
