

# Honor Infractions

Four students have been found guilty of violations of the Honor System. One student confessed to the infraction and has been suspended from the University for the remainder of the academic year.

One student was found guilty of a violation which occurred midway through the first semester. Final action was delayed for medical reasons. After the delay, an action for appeal was introduced. The appeal was processed and there was no change in the verdict.

The student has been suspended from the Rice University for the remainder of the academic year, effective the date of the violation.

The other cases were trials in which, by a unanimous verdict, two students were found guilty. One student was suspended from school until the fall semester, 1967.

The other case was not a major violation of the System, and the student was placed on disciplinary probation for the remainder of the year, with loss of credit in the course in which the irregularity occurred.
