

# Fulbrights Given To Three Riceites

The United States Department of State has announced the awarding of Fulbright grants for graduate study abroad to three Rice students.

Diana Dee Green will study Contemporary German Literature at the University of Bonn, Germany; Douglas Burnham Holmes will study Chemical Engineering at the Technological University at Delft, Netherlands; and Jo Marie Holt will be at the University of Montpellier, France, to study French literature.

**MISS GREEN** is a senior; Miss Holt and Holmes are graduate students.

The three students are among the seven hundred who have received grants provided by the Fulbright Act for study in the thirty-one countries which participate in the program of exchange with the United States.

**RECIPIENTS OF** the grants are selected by the Board of Foreign Scholarships, the members of which are appointed by the President of the United States.

The international educational exchange program is designed to promote a better understanding

Students wishing to go abroad for the 1963-64 academic year should apply between May and November 1, 1962.
