

# Johnstone Amused By Craig's View Of Study Habits

To the Editor:

I was amused at Dr. Craig's remark that

"The Library is open 95 hours a week at present: do you mean to say that this is not enough time for the students to get their lessons if they show a little foresight in planning their work?"

Your "Editors' note" revealed one misimplication in this statement by recognizing that frequently enough study-hours coincide with Library-hours.

Still another misimplication is that all of Rice's students want "to get their lessons" and to be done with them—as in grammar school—presumably to join in family games, to watch TV, or to rush outside for play with the dog.
