

# Old Rice Reviewed in Exhibit

The latest Fondren Library exhibit is "Know Your Campus" and introduces to this year's Rice students the campus of 1912 and its subsequent changes.

The wall exhibit included the original plan of the campus, a magazine printing of the Charter of 1891 of The Rice Institute, and a sketch of the humorous caricatures of Rice professors that Mr. James Chillman made to decorate the Chemistry Lecture Hall, built in 1926.

Pictures of the ground-breaking ceremony of 1910, the first class of 59 students which began their studies September 26, 1912, and the academic festival (Octo-

ber 10-12, 1912) which officially opened the Rice Institute are featured in the display cases.

A series of photographs of all the buildings erected on campus since the Administration Building (1912) ends with pictures of the yet-to-be completed Memorial Student Center.

Copies of Vol. 1, No. 1 of Rice Thresher (January 15, 1916) and Vol. I of the Campanile (1916) are displayed along with portraits of William Marsh Rice and Mr. Edgar Odell Lovett, first president of Rice.

This display in the second floor foyer of Fondren Library will remain until December 15 when

the next exhibit, on Christmas Art, will be presented.
