

Gilbert & Sullivan's 'Iolanthe' May 5-6

The Gilbert and Sullivan Society of the Faculty and Students of Rice University will present their production of "Iolanthe," an operetta in two acts, May 5 and 6 in Hamman Hall.

Gilbert and Sullivan, the Lerner-Loewe team of the nineties, collaborated on the operetta, with Gilbert writing the original book, and Arthur Sullivan composing the music.

This presentation of "Iolanthe" or "The Peer and the Peri" will allow Rice students to see many professors and other campus personalities on stage. Dorothy Iliffe plays the title role of Iolanthe, Ellen Sweet portrays the Fairy Queen, and Mrs. Shirley Hall is Phyllis, an Arcadian shepherdess.

The three fairies—Leila, Celia, and Fleta—are played by Mrs. Raemond Craig, Mrs. Madith De-Zurko, and Miss Carolyn Cason.

The male leads are James Morehead, Walter Keith, Ronald Vince, Jack Conner, and Thomas Brackett.

Arthur Hall of the Shepherd School of Music will conduct the orchestra, and Mrs. Sue Pierce is the stage director. The architects and the army take bows for the sets.
