

National Science Foundation Gives 1960 Fellowships

The National Science Foundation announced the appointment of nine Rice students to Fellowships for graduate study at Rice.

Four Rice students were awarded Fellowships to study at other graduates schools: M. R. Berkman, Mechanical Engineering, at Cal Tech; S. Grabiner, Mathematics, at Harvard; R. M. Goldwyn Electrical Engineering at Harvard, and L. K. Runnels, Chemistry, at Yale.

Three students of other universities have elected to pursue graduate study at Rice: K. J. Carroll, Physics, from Loyola, W. C. Pusey, Geology, from Amherst, and Mary L. Wheat, Mathematics, from Nebraska.
