

Owl Netters To Host Powerful Pan Am College

High favored to capture their third consecutive conference crown despite the loss of the conference's defending singles champion Ronnie Fisher, coach Sammy Giammalva's Rice tennis squad faces what may be their sternest test of the 1960 season next Thursday as they entertain powerful Pan American College of Edinburg.

Fisher, who announced last week that he was passing up the 1960 season to concentrate on his studies, was named this week to the third team of the Wheaties' Sports Federation All-America team. Receiving honorable mention on the twenty-one man team was Paul Como, runner-up to Fisher in last year's conference tourney.

Either Como or sophomore Neal Marcus will play No. 1 singles for the Owls against Pan Am next Thursday. Conference doubles champion Art Foust will hold down the number three position, with letterman Doug Bashrum in the number four singles match.

The strong Pan American squad will be led by Australian stars John Sharpe and Don Russell.
