

# Arkansas, TCU Win Trophy for Sportsmanship

TCU and Arkansas received the 1958 *Southwest Conference* Sportsmanship trophy in the Cotton Bowl in the first dual award of the trophy. Arkansas will have the trophy for the first semester and co-winner TCU will own it until the 1960 Cotton Bowl. Rice was last year's winner, and tied this year with SMU for second place.

The Sportsmanship Committee is composed of the Student Association president, newspaper editors, head cheerleaders, and varsity representatives from the SWC schools.

Each individual rated the other schools in the conference on a one to six point basis, the team (or teams) with the lowest number of points winning the cup.

The all-student committee, which met December 31 in Dallas, also discussed various ways of improving Conference Sportsmanship, and decided to send a letter to each school asking it to refrain from any "discourtesies" at games — less specifically, crude songs, and so forth. (S. A. President Huff, who is this year's Sportsmanship Committee Chairman, noted that the singing of the "To Hell" songs at the A&M and Longhorn games was a significant factor weighing against Rice in the contest this year.
