

Rice rated 'tops' for med students

The chances for getting admitted to medical school for Rice University students are higher than at any other school in the nation, according to a survey made by the Association of American Medical Colleges.

Rice is the only school in the Southwest among the 25 colleges and universities listed by the survey as having a significant proportion of its graduates accepted by medical schools.

The survey, covering the 1964-65 term and published in "Datagrams," reveals that 85.1% of Rice graduates who applied for entrance to medical schools were admitted.

Institutions such as Harvard, Columbia, Cornell, Yale and Princeton rank considerably lower, even though the total number of students accepted is higher.

Six out of every 30 students in the 1964-65 graduating class at Rice planned to become physicians. Approximately five out of every 30 were admitted to medical schools.
