

Republican Sees State Problem In Business Forces

"The South is going to industrialize within the next twelve years. The question is whether Texas is going to participate in the nation's forward movement," state senatorial candidate Jim McBride told a small group of Young Republicans at Rice last Thursday.

"We've had enough of screwball politics," the Bellaire High School American history instructor said. The future of Texas lies in industrial development. But the key to industrial development lies in Austin.

"WHEN TEXAS is governed by men who appreciate business development, we will see a period of rapid industrialization. The tax policy of 'soak business' must be turned around."

McBride, a member of the Bellaire City Council, is on leave from his teaching job to conduct his campaign against Democratic nominee Cris Cole.

The two are seeking the position vacated by incumbent Bob Baker, an unsuccessful candidate for Lieutenant Governor.
