RICE INSTITUTE COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES START

Caps and Gowns Fail to Arrive; Outfits Borrowed For Graduation

Rice Institute seniors begin their program for commencement week Saturday morning with the "Senior American," the annual hop, which will be given in the Rice Institute hall starting at 9:30 a. m.

The senior banquet will be given Saturday night at the Brazos court, when 85 of the class will attend. Emmet McFarland, president of the senior class, has been selected as toastmaster. No special program has been planned for the banquet, and students will be called upon for impromptu toasts. The faculty has been invited.

The Very Rev. Father Kirwin will deliver the baccalaureate sermon at 9 a. m. Sunday, and Judge J. C. Hutcheson will make the commencement address at 8 a. m. Monday, when the ceremonies begin. The garden party is to take place Monday afternoon. Dr. and Mrs. Odell Lovett follow an annual custom of giving the seniors a garden party at the institute.

Arrival of the year book, "The Campanile," created quite a bit of excitement Friday at the institute and a mad rush was made by the Rice "studes" to obtain a copy of the book, which is said to be the best ever gotten out by a Rice senior class.

There was considerable consternation among the senior class when it was found out that the freight embargo made it impossible for the caps and gowns ordered by the members from an Eastern supply house to arrive in time for commencement. To graduate in anything but this traditional garb would not be graduating, they decided. Officers of the class, however, got busy and borrowed enough outfits for all but five members of the large class. University students were asked for the loan of their treasured garbs and parted with them in order that a tradition might not be broken.

A meeting of the girls of the senior class will be held at 2 p. m. Saturday in the Girls' club room for the purpose of fitting caps and gowns.
