April ~~March~~ 9<sup>th</sup> 1863

Dear Mother

I received your letter of  
The 5<sup>th</sup> to night. I wrote to Father some  
time ago did he receive it. There was  
no papers in the box you sent. The note  
was in, by that they knew it was mine  
for the side of the box that was marked  
was broken off. President Lincoln has  
been here since last Saturday he is  
reviewing the Troops. I was out yesterday  
about two miles to attend one. it was  
a splendid sight. report says about  
seventy five thousand were out yesterday  
Mrs Lincoln and Secretary Stanton  
were out in a carriage. The Presidents  
little boy rode a little pony between  
his Father and Gen Hooker. he is not  
as large as George. as they rode up

and down the lines followed by  
about thirty Staff Officers the little  
fellow would raise his cap as cunning  
as you please. we are having quite  
pleasant weather now. all the papers  
I get from you is once in a while a  
Glens Falls paper. I get one from  
Amos nearly every day. Not being in  
a writing mood to night I close this  
apology for a letter. leaves all well
