1. *Introit and Kyrie.* Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. A hymn befits thee, O God in Zion, and to Thee a vow shall be fulfilled in Jerusalem. Hear my prayer, for unto Thee all flesh shall come. Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.

2. *Offertorium.* Lord Jesus Christ, king of Glory, liberate the souls of all the faithful departed from the pains of hell and from the deep pit; deliver them from the lion's mouth; let not hell swallow them up, let them not fall into darkness. Sacrifices and prayers of praise, O Lord, we offer to Thee. Receive them, O Lord, on behalf of those souls we commemorate this day. Grant them, O Lord, to pass from death unto life, which once thou promised to Abraham and to his seed. Amen.
